JOB DESCRIPTION

- TITLE:** Art Teacher
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Certification in Art and Bachelor's Degree. Additional qualifications as the Board may find appropriate and/or desirable.
- JOB GOAL:** To develop in each pupil an interest in and the ability for creative expression in visual terms, using skills and techniques of artistic expression appropriate to the pupil's interests and abilities; to develop aesthetic understanding and appreciation; to discover and develop talents of pupils in the field of art.

PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

1. Teaches knowledge and skills in art, including crafts, drawing, painting, lettering, design, commercial art, art history, and three-dimensional art, following the course of study adopted by the Board of Education, and other learning activities.
2. Provides instruction by which pupils develop aesthetic concepts and appreciation and the ability to make qualitative judgments about art.
3. Demonstrates techniques in activities such as drawing, painting, and modeling, using standard and teacher-prepared instructional aides.
4. Develops instructional plans and organizes class time to provide a balanced program of instruction, demonstration, and working time.
5. Provides individual and small-group instruction to adapt the curriculum to the needs of pupils with varying intellectual and artistic abilities, and to accommodate a variety of instructional activities.
6. Establishes and maintains standards of pupil behavior needed to provide an orderly and productive studio environment.
7. Instructs pupils in proper care and use of tools and equipment.

8. Organizes storage areas and controls use of materials, equipment and tools to prevent loss or abuse, and to minimize time required for distribution and collection.
9. Evaluates each pupil's performance and growth in knowledge and aesthetic understandings, and prepares progress reports.
10. Selects and requisitions books, instructional materials, tools, instructional aides, and maintains required inventory records.
11. Plans and presents art displays and exhibitions designed to exhibit pupils' work for the school and the community.
12. May sponsor exhibits from outside the school.
13. Maintains professional competence through in-service education activities provided by the district and/or in self-selected professional growth activities.
14. Maintains an audible record of pupil attendance and makes daily reports of pupils absent each period.
15. Communicates with parents and school counselors on pupil progress.
16. Participates in curriculum and other developmental programs within the school or on a district level.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Ten month year. Salary and work year to be established by the Board.
